Annual Car Show

Due to the late date of the show and the amount of those who have attended in the past saying they would not be able to participate this year, it was decided to postpone the Car Show to either early spring or early fall 2025. This was not an easy recommendation for me to make, but I feel that if we were to hold the show, it would have resulted in a loss of revenue compared to the fundraiser it was intended to be.
